The Lincolnshire Collaborative brings together the NHS organisations in the county with the Lincolnshire Local Medical Committee, the statutory representative body for GPs and their practices, working together to promote Lincolnshire as an attractive place to live, train and work.

Location

Since Lincolnshire is a large county, located within the East Midlands and along the east coast, our GP practices vary greatly in their size and location.

Covering 2,500 square miles, Lincolnshire is sandwiched between Cambridgeshire to the south and Yorkshire to the north, with good road and rail links to London, Nottingham, Manchester, Birmingham, Leicester, Sheffield, Leeds and the rest of the UK.





Things to do in Lincolnshire

Lincolnshire has a full calendar of activities all year round! Whether you want to attend a large internationally renowned event, or a small local village fayre, Lincolnshire has an array of festivals, events, activities and markets to choose from.

Burghley House Horse Trials boasts over 160,000 visitors during four days. There are around 600 carefully selected exhibitors, an average of 80 of the world's top competitors and a prize fund of £250,000. 21st century Burghley Horse Trials are set in the magnificent parkland of Burghley House in Stamford.

Belvoir Castle near Grantham is the ancestral home of the Duke of Rutland. Crowning a hill, its turrets and towers rise over the Vale of Belvoir and it is one of the most beautiful regency homes in England. The castle and its gardens are open to the public throughout the year and the grounds host live music and other entertainment throughout the year.

The Lincolnshire County Show is a true celebration of rural Lincolnshire with an eclectic mix of breathtaking entertainment, food, shopping, music, horticulture and farm life - for the perfect day out. As one of the best county shows, you will be spoilt for choice with hours of non-stop entertainment and an adventure into local history, produce and the finest offerings available right here in Lincolnshire.

A contemporary cathedral city with more than 2,000 years of history, Lincoln Christmas Market is the perfect setting during the festive period. Visitors are welcomed from around the world to enjoy cultural entertainment, to stroll along the cobbles of the cultural quarter of the city and browse over 250 stalls nestled within the medieval square and surroundings. A truly traditional festive experience for the whole family.

Cycling events - The city of Lincoln has become a hotspot for cyclists and spectators with events such as the Lincoln Uphill Dash, Lincoln Festival of Cycling and the Lincoln Grand Prix. Covering 13 laps and 102 miles around the historic parts of Lincoln, the Lincoln Grand Prix has been voted the country's favourite one day cycle race by riders and the public.

Education in Lincolnshire

Lincolnshire boasts a number of outstanding schools and is one of the few counties still using the eleven plus system of examinations for grammar schools, retaining an excellent mix of selective and comprehensive education.

There are 14 grammar schools and one bi-lateral school King Edward's VI Humanities College in Spilsby. There are also 42 comprehensive, secondary modern and non-selective academy schools.

Lincoln is also home to two excellent universities, with the University of Lincoln growing fast and climbing more places in university league tables than almost any other institution. In June 2017 it was awarded Gold in the prestigious Teaching Excellence Framework, the national independent assessment of teaching quality, student support and graduate success in higher education.

Having established an international reputation for the quality of teaching and research, academics and students have worked together on major projects across areas as varied as cancer treatment, water conservation and low-carbon technology.

Bishop Grosseteste University is a beautifully green and pleasant campus, where teaching staff deliver a first class education, turning out graduates of the highest calibre. The university has recently undergone an explosion of growth, expanding and developing a portfolio of courses into even more exciting new areas.



Housing in Lincolnshire

Lincolnshire is the second largest of the English counties and is an area of outstanding natural beauty with very competitively priced properties, benefiting from being situated in picturesque towns and idyllic villages. House prices in Lincolnshire are remarkably low with an overall average price of £166,707, similar in terms of sold prices to nearby Nottinghamshire (£168,891), but cheaper than Rutland (£286,035) and Leicestershire (£201,186).*

The NHS in Lincolnshire is transforming the way it works to ensure that services work seamlessly for the benefit of patients.

The Lincolnshire Sustainability and Transformation Partnership is an ambitious programme working to redefine how care and support is delivered across the county to ensure sustainable and accessible services are provided now and in the future.

The partnership of health and care organisations will do this by keeping people healthier for longer, improving care, reducing health inequalities and making sure it does not spend more money than it receives.

As part of this, the 100 Lincolnshire GP practices are transforming the way they work.

These strong individual practices have begun to federate so that they can provide 21st century general practice at scale.


We are now looking for GPs who can innovate and diversify, who want to work in new ways, and with the wider health and social care teams.

GP vocational training scheme

In Lincolnshire we offer a small training programme to tailor the three year training to individual needs. Based in Boston and Lincoln, the hospital posts run for four months and include areas such as diabetes, cardiology, care of the elderly, stroke unit, A&E, obstetrics and gynaecology, paediatrics, psychiatry and palliative care – all of which are very relevant to General Practice.

Opportunities to progress

Our staff are living proof of the opportunities available in Lincolnshire. We are proud of our track record of investing in the training and development of our staff and also boast many successes at national and regional awards.



United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust (ULHT) is one of the largest acute care trusts in the country, providing a wide range of specialist health and care services.

In an average year the Trust treats more than 180,000 patients in A&E, over 600,000 outpatients, almost 100,000 inpatients and delivers over 5,000 babies.

More than 7,500 highly trained and dedicated staff care for patients across four hospitals at Lincoln, Boston, Grantham and Louth, and also provide services from a number of other hospitals.

The Trust boasts a leading heart centre at Lincoln, which has some of the best survival rates from heart attacks and out-of-hospital cardiac arrests, an innovative end-of-life care hospice sited at Grantham hospital and newly refurbished £2 million neonatal unit at Lincoln hospital.

With an annual income of almost £450 million, the trust prides itself in attracting and retaining dedicated and compassionate staff who want to provide 'excellence in rural healthcare' for the people of Lincolnshire.

Lincolnshire Community Health Services NHS Trust (LCHS) is a fast moving and innovative organisation, driven by passion and enthusiasm for delivering great care, close to home.

Staff collectively see thousands of people across Lincolnshire every day, supporting them to manage their own health at home and reducing the need to go into hospital.

This support is delivered through a wide range of community healthcare services including general and specialist integrated community nursing and therapy; children's therapy; safeguarding; sexual health and podiatry.

The Trust has inpatient beds and urgent care services in community hospitals in Skegness, Louth, Gainsborough and Spalding, and countywide urgent care services including the Clinical Assessment Service and GP out of hours. The Trust also provides care at Peterborough Minor Illness and Injury Unit.

Rated Good by the Care Quality Commission (CQC), the extraordinary teams and individuals at LCHS were praised for being 'overwhelmingly' caring.

Staff are encouraged to drive innovation and the Trust offers opportunities for development including apprenticeships, placements for student nurses and allied health professionals, mentoring and supports learning beyond registration.

Lincolnshire Partnership NHS Foundation Trust (LPFT) is the principal provider of mental health and learning disability services in the county. It was one of the first foundation trusts to be established in the country and is rated as Good overall by the Care Quality Commission.

The Trust is committed to continuously improving the quality of care it provides, delivering safe services with a focus on recovery and ensuring service users are at the heart of everything it does. It recognises the importance of ensuring services are fair and equitable to all and celebrates the diversity of its staff, service users and carers.

The Trust has an active research department, helping to lead the way in medical research in the field of dementia and other sub-specialties. The organisation delivers research projects at a national level in collaboration with a wide range of partners and is one of the UK's top recruiters in industry studies. The Trust is also committed to non-industry studies and is involved in projects exploring physical healthcare needs, challenging stigma and supporting the role of social workers.

For two consecutive years the Trust has topped an East Midlands poll for the quality of training provided to junior doctors, as well as being named as a Centre of Excellence for provision of Wellbeing through Work service, helping service users into paid employment.
